SIGNS OF SUICIDE PROGRAM REACHES AREA STUDENTS

Suicide prevention efforts have been increased locally through the Signs of Suicide (SOS) program and other evidence-based programs. The SOS program trains students to recognize signs of depression and suicide risk in their peers and trains them to ACT: <u>A</u>cknowledge (tell your peer what signs you notice), <u>C</u>are (protect friends' safety rather than keeping risks as a secret), <u>T</u>ell/<u>T</u>ake (make sure the student and information about their risk factors is brought to an adult). This program can include depression screening, with individual follow-up sessions and parent contacts, to facilitate appropriate referrals for services.

In Wayne and Holmes Counties, Jim Foley, LISW-S, Director of Community Education and Prevention, with the help of a grant through the Mental Health and Recovery Board, is implementing this training, screening, and referral program to several school districts during the spring semester. Participating districts include Norwayne, West Holmes, Dalton, Northwestern, Wooster, Chippewa, and Smithville. Another suicide prevention program for the general community, Question-Persuade-Refer, also offered with the help of MHRB funding, is available as well.
