CANS Training

On April 5 & 6, David Coleman, Ph.D. and Tara Willis, LPCC-S attended training on Transformational Collaborative Outcomes Management with Children and Adolescents (TCOM). The training was sponsored by Wayne County Probate & Juvenile Court, in collaboration with the Wayne County Family & Children First Council, and the Mental Health & Recovery Board of Wayne & Holmes Counties. Training was provided by Mark Lardner, MSW, LCSW-C, University of Maryland School of Social Work, for using the Child & Adolescent Needs & Strengths (CANS) rating scale to promote planning and oversite among child-serving agencies in Wayne County.

The CANS assessment tool is intended to be administered collaboratively with professionals, children and their families for supporting meaningful service planning and promoting better outcomes where potential family disruptions are identified. The use of a common assessment tool among community partners will more effectively communicate the level of care needs of multi-system youth for creating a coordinated care plan, while tracking the progress made over time. Approximately 50 professionals from local organizations including Wayne County Juvenile Court, Wayne County DJFS, Wayne County Board of Developmental Disabilities, Wooster City Schools and the Counseling Center attending the training.

"May is Mental Health Month"

Since 1949, May has been observed as National Mental Health Awareness Month. Each year millions of Americans face the reality of living with a mental health condition. We know that 50 percent of Americans will meet the criteria for a diagnosable mental health condition sometime in their life, and half of those will develop conditions by the age of 14. Today, more people die from suicide in the United States than from traffic accidents or homicides, and 22 veterans are lost to suicide daily.

In 2013, President Obama proclaimed May as *Mental Health Awareness Month*. It is a time to break through the stigma associated with mental illness, provide support, education, and advocacy and bring the issue of mental health to the forefront of our thoughts.
