## ADHD PUBLIC FORUM

On Monday October 26, at the Wayne County Public Library, from 6:00 to 8:00 you can participate in a public forum on ADHD (Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder). The forum is for parents of children who wonder whether their child has ADHD, or wonder what to do about a recent diagnosis, and what to expect over the child's lifetime. There will be a panel of experts who will be speaking briefly and available for questions. Panelists include a pediatrician, a psychotherapist, a parent of a young child with ADHD, an adult who has lived for years with ADHD, a teacher, and an intervention specialist.

Jim Foley, Director of Community Education and Prevention at the Counseling Center, helped organize this event, and will be speaking about the value of psychotherapy with ADHD, including cognitive and behavioral management of ADHD symptoms, as well as improved understanding and reduced stigma for those with ADHD and their caretakers. This forum, sponsored by the Wayne County Family and Children First Council, with support from the Mental Health and Recovery Board, is a follow-up to a forum on Autism Spectrum Disorders held in the spring, attended by over 60 people.
