FISCAL YEAR ENDS WITH HIGH SERVICE DELIVERY

June 30 marks the end of the Counseling Center's fiscal year and it is noteworthy that during the recently completed fiscal year, the agency provided 166,190 units of various mental health services to the community and closed the year with an active caseload of 2,938 different individuals. While all new referrals can be scheduled for a timely assessment, and all persons in crisis can be seen on the same day, some specialized programs continue to have a wait list. Wait lists are prioritized based on acuity.

MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID

Mark Weaver, LPCC-S, Director of Community Education and Prevention Services, was recently designated by the National Council for Behavioral Health as a provider of Mental Health First Aid training, specifically in rural areas. Weaver has been designated to provide the basic Mental Health First Aid training since last fall, but the National Council is encouraging additional training and additional credentialing for those providers who wish to offer the training in rural areas. Weaver is one of only several credentialed providers in the entire state of Ohio.
